This past July, 160 GHS grads, spouses and some friends had 86 of the 95 cabins on a Viking River Cruise on the Danube from Nuremberg to Budapest. 89 of us even flew on the same planes together.

Whoa! What fun we had!

I want to tell you about our 10 day adventure together, but, first I want to relate to you the quite surprising story of how this whole big vacation happened in the first place.

Sandra Issues "a Challenge"

My wife Sally and I were at a Christmas party in 2016 when Sandra Vibrock Mayes tells

me, "I have challenge for you!"

Right, I'm thinking.
It's going to be something silly, like she is going to challenge me to eat a bug or something.
"Here is my challenge

"Here is my challenge for you," she said. "I know you and Sally like to go on all these Viking

cruises, so I want you to pick one for 2018 and

tell other classmates about it. Wherever it is, Gene and I will go."

I still didn't take her seriously. But, when she said it again, I knew she meant it, and I was ready to answer the challenge. I immediately thought of the scene in Romeo and Juliet:

I spent the month of January answering her challenge, picking just the right trip and preparing an eight page letter with all of the details thoroughly covered. Since we had known them just about forever – Sandra lived next door to Sally growing up, and I played football with Gene on the 63 and 64 teams – I was excited about traveling with them for the first time.

Signups Unlike Anything Expected

Sally and I figured a few couples – five at the very most – would want to join us. Boy oh boy, were we wrong! We announced the trip in late January, and in the first week alone, 66 people booked. By two months later, we had sold out the ship.

We even "broke" Viking's software. They link all of the group bookings together, but the programmer who designed the software assumed that more than 100 people would never travel together. We had to wait for a software patch before we would continue the linking of the bookings.

When we filled the ship with bookings, it was still almost 1.5 years until we left. I used that time to put out 22 newsletters, so everyone knew everything about the trip before they left. Sally and I also hosted two parties at our home for people to meet each other in advance and ask questions. Over 100 came to each party, so the fun started way before the trip began.



Classes of 1955 to 1979 Went

We had a wide range of classes that cruised with us. The second youngest person to go was Lisa Schillerstrom Locke '79. Lisa was joined by her husband Mike.



The oldest was Don Freeman '55, whom many in our group knew as Dr. Don, since he used to be their physician. Don traveled with the youngest member of our group, Sydni Freeman, his granddaughter who was in her late 20s.

What really helped was that everyone wore the nametags I made them. Even the crew told me how much they appreciated that.

Lots of Relatives Went Too

We had 15 married couples who were both GHS. We had 4 sets who went who were parent and child. And we had 7 sets of siblings who joined us, many of whom were both GHS.

Although most came from Texas, people also came from states as far apart as Washington and Florida.

The Other 18 People

There were 18 people on board not in our group. Most of these had booked before us. The program director, who let us do anything we wanted, let me specially address the other 18 at our first ship get-together. I told them we would very much like to adopt them and make them honorary Garland Owls, but, if they wanted instead to be left alone, we do that as well.

The 18 all wanted to join us, so I made them nametags. They told me at the end of the cruise that they were glad they had joined us, since it was the most fun that they had ever had on a cruise.

Our Program Director Oliver Groszer was a wild and crazy guy who had circus experience. He could and did get out of a straightjacket and juggle balls as well as sing and dance and generally keep us in stitches the whole time.

But most all he was a gracious and hard-working host who turned the ship over to us. Among many fond memories was the time a bunch of the crew got together and went to the ship's public address system and said in unison, "Howdy Y'all!" and then giggled like crazy.

We kept having so much fun talking to each other that it was hard for poor Oliver to keep us quiet during the daily briefing. I told Oliver one evening to give me the microphone. I yelled "Owls, SHUT UP!" This worked so well that Oliver had me do it every evening.

While stuck on the tarmac waiting for lightning to pass before we could pull into the gate on the way over, the airline crew let us get up so we got together in various groups and swapped stories. 
